TRAFFIC REPORT

Traffic on Beverly Glen — it's too heavy and too fast. You've had drivers zip past you as you attempt to pull into your own driveway, and you've had drivers go around you—cutting across into the oncoming traffic lane—as you drive the speed limit—or even 5 mph over on Beverly Glen. What's a Glenite to do? Well, you can start by joining the Traffic Committee! We are here to find creative ways to slow traffic down in our neighborhood, and to get people to treat it just like any other residential neighborhood! Here are a few quick things you can do:

<u>Slow Down</u> Drive the 30 MPH speed limit on Beverly Glen. Drivers behind you may be cranky, but you are serving as a role model for those who drive our canyon.

Call LAPD at 213-473-0222 and let them know if you have experienced someone driving too fast or dangerously, like zipping into oncoming traffic to go around a driver going the speed limit. LAPD needs to hear from us. You don't need to give a license plate – just let them know that we need additional speed enforcement in the Glen.

Sign the petition asking shops and restaurants at the Glen Centre to ask their vendors and suppliers to slow down their delivery vehicles. Trucks speeding on Beverly Glen present a danger to residents, children and pets. You can "sign" the petition by e-mailing your name and the name of the street you live on (don't need your address) to Traffic Committee chair Evelyn Alexander at traffic@beverlyglen.org. If you would like a printed copy of this petition and can ask some neighbors to sign it as well, please ask Evelyn and she will send you a copy!

<u>Stay informed</u> You can learn more about the improvements to the 405 freeway, which has begun to impact traffic in our area, from the project website: http://www.metro.net/projects/I-405/.

Additionally, we are working with LAPD's community Speedwatch supervisor to train members of our community to use the LAPD's laser speed gun. Once trained, we will be able to monitor traffic in small groups. Speeding drivers will be sent a letter by LAPD informing them that they have been seen speeding in our area. No tickets will be issued, but other areas with a community Speedwatch have reduced the number of speeding cars in their communities. Your Traffic Committee is also working to identify other traffic calming improvement options. All Beverly Glen residents are welcome to join in this effort – please set a good example for visitors through our community and drive the speed limit!

BEL AIR BEVERLY CREST NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL (BABCNC) BOARD REPORT

LADWP

BABCNC passed a motion to request the City Council reject the recent rate increase and continues to work with our Councilman, Paul Koretz, to create a rate-payer advocacy committee. In light of the water rates that had no consideration for hillside water demands as well as the recent prolonged blackout, LADWP must have more control from its shareholders and owners, you the residents.

Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir

Coming to a head at an expected early April vote, the Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir will finally have a game plan to cover the drinking water reservoir. Some final details about public access and other issues are being worked out but ROBG sits on a subcommittee for the Coalition to Preserve Open Space, the main negotiator for local residents. Remember Lower Stone Canyon is now only used for emergency purposes and why it remains uncovered, Upper Stone Canyon must be covered due to federal regulations, how, how much and what will be left are to be determined.

LAPD

Captain Evangely Nathan, Commanding Officer for West Area informed BABCNC that West Area will get 8 additional units (16 officers) in addition to 10 people sent in a recent transfer. Much needed for our hard working West LAPD officers.

Brush Clearance

Many have seen the notices from LAFD, it's nothing new, it's an old 1999 ordinance but with the budget crunch, City of LA is looking for everyway to collect fees not previously collected. Not to worry, you can self-inspect, read the instructions, take your photos, send in your documentation and if the inspector feels no further inspection is needed, no fee needed. However, if you don't send it in or don't do a good job, they will have to inspect and charge \$13 for the inspection fee. Brush Clearance is a matter of life and death for us in the hillsides, take it seriously and report neighbors who do not take it seriously as they endanger your home! MOONSHINE AND THE WILD 20'S

There was a lot of rough and illegal stuff going on in the Glen during the days of Prohibition," says Janie Padgett, standing at the wooden stairs leading down to the basement of her home on Beverly Glen Place. "This was originally a one-room cabin built in 1912 and has since been remodeled." Janie is known to many Glenites as the lovely belly dancer at the annual summer Fair. In the 20's this was where then-residents made "moonshine" (unlawful homemade whiskey) in a "still" (distilling apparatus) and bottles of the stuff were stored and hidden. When Janie was little in the '60s, the Glen was a hippie haven and she saw Steve McQueen riding his motorcycle to the 4 Oaks and Hell's Angels fighting there. Her neighbors were babysitters and they told her the stories of the 20's, of men hiding out in the bushes with shotguns, and cops looking for them, and of bar busts and bribes.

Getting up to the Glen before those early days was by wagon from the area that is now Santa Monica Blvd. and Wilshire Blvd. The road, known as Brown Canyon, ended where Beverly Glen Place now ends; the road going through to the Valley was not yet there. There were bars, a dance hall and yes, a whorehouse.

That would be the three- story at the end of the Place. It had redwood siding, with the dance hall downstairs and the ladies upstairs. You could imagine a Mae West-type saying, "Why don't you come up and see me sometime?" According to Janie, there was a bar on the boulevard called, "The Glen" around 1508, and its competition was the original Four Oaks.

At 1216 North Beverly Glen actor John Barrymore had his hunting lodge and hideaway. Of course there was the notorious Kennedy murder -- the August 6, 1921 Beverly Glen shooting with a .12 gauge buckshot that almost took off J. Belton Kennedy's head. It seems that J. Belton's father, John D. Kennedy, never got over the death of his son, or the exoneration of the accused, Arthur C. Burch. The 62 year-old father was in court for assault and battery. Said Kennedy, "This is the fist time I have met Burch face to face since his trial for the murder of my boy. At the sight of him I was seized with a frenzy and choked him until he began squealing and they came and separated us." Kennedy changed his plea from not guilty to guilty and the judge gave him thirty days, suspended, with the caveat that if Kennedy saw Burch coming, Kennedy was to "go to the other side of the street."

Janie Padgett's home was bought by her parents, Carol and Norm Padgett (famed UCLA rugby coach) in 1957, and the basement where the still was kept was left intact. For years the Padgetts found bottles of every description surfacing from the mud -- from Milk of Magnesia to cough syrup -- anything glass was used to hold the booze. Today underground water still sends mud up to collect, and ghostly bottles still appear. Janie plans to restore the house and of course, to keep the basement with all its Glen history.

She was recognized by the City of Los Angeles, State of California, and National Council for Social Studies as the "Outstanding Middle School Teacher of the Year."

But here in Beverly Glen we will remember her as a wonderful neighbor in the 1900 block on the Boulevard. When she wasn't on a plane you would see Merrell in her aquamarine Thunderbird convertible, her red hair blowing in the wind on her way to the UCLA pool or a quick bite of sushi at the top of the hill. Merrell was one of our lovely barmaids at the Glen Fair and we will sorely miss her smiling face this year as we celebrate the fair's 50th anniversary. Merrell raised her two wonderful children Victoria and Macabee from small children to outstanding adults in the Glen and we commiserate with their loss.

Merrell would have been 64 on June 27th, and although she was taken from us much too soon she lived every moment of her life to the fullest. So we say "good job Merrell, enjoy the next journey."

GLEN ASTRONOMER DIRECTS IMPRESSIVE NEW SKY SURVEY

Ned Wright, UCLA Professor of physics and astronomy as well as distinguished Glenite of long standing, now leads the new Wide Field Infrared Survey Telescope Project which will greatly increase our ability to catalogue and photograph objects in space as remote as distant galaxies and as close as nearby asteroids and comets. Ned comments on the motivation for the project, saying "We have a deep seated desire to know what the universe is like and how our solar system came into being." The new telescope with its vastly increased sensitivity to infrared wavelengths of light will do a lot to increase that knowledge. Ned also reminds us that UCLA continues to maintain its dominant position in the field of infrared astronomy. Congratulations to Ned and to UCLA!


