Construction Updates:

1510/1516 N. Beverly Glen - According to city building inspector John Coleman the property at 1510/1516 Beverly Glen lost its financing. As you can see the fence was taken down which makes the site unsafe for pedestrians/children. Legally, there is no requirement for them to keep a fence around the property. Metal pipes stored on Beverly Glen have almost caused several auto accidents and there are drainage issues that could cause problems when the rainy season comes. This is just another home abandoned during construction in the Beverly Glen area. They may not be competed for many years! We are trying to resolve the problems with this property but what we really need is to require a completion bond on any new property when a permit is issued. This is going to be a big political issue and we are going to need your help!

Development Updates:

112 N. Beverly Glen - The owner submitted for a zoning adjustment for higher boundary wall, rear yard setback, permitting construction of a guard house in front half and tennis court in front of lot. Nearby homeowners and a representative from ROBG attended and expressed concern. Working with the applicant, ROBG and nearby homeowners were able to negotiate concessions to address traffic, visual improvements and construction related parking and traffic concessions. Another great example of what ROBG, homeowners and responsible owners/developers can accomplish.

1551 N. Crater Lane - Application has been filed for proposed two story addition, no hearings known to date.

10501 Seabury Lane - Zoning Administrator denied request for adjustments from various code requirements for construction of a 2,400 SF single family home. Applicant has requested an appeal, no further updates.

Sandal Lane/Mars Lane - A tentative tract map application has been filed for subdividing 1 lot into 11 lots around the property located at 10505 Mars Lane. ROBG has been monitoring it along with Bel Air Association, the nearby homeowners are organizing opposition, no hearings or updates since filing of application.

Hillside Federation Update

Dan Palmer, Glen resident for thirteen years, is the Treasurer of the Hillside Federation, formally known as The Federation of Hillside and Canyon Associations, Inc., and he's also our Board's representative to the Federation. As such, Dan attends Federation meetings and provides Glen residents updates on what is happening with the Los Angeles Department of City Planning as it impacts hillside and canyon communities and land. Ongoing areas of concern are mansionization (housing structures that cut too deeply into hillsides) and commercial overdevelopment, such as the proposed expansion of the Gene Autry Museum and the Southwest Museum. Federation members attend city meetings to help ensure that opinions and concerns of residents and those interested in conservation of the natural beauty of canyon and hillside land are heard and taken into consideration. The group meets the first Wednesday of each month (except for August), and the next meeting is scheduled for September 2nd at 7pm. Traffic

We all know that traffic is an important issue in our Beverly Glen community. The traffic committee is here to give Beverly Glen residents an opportunity to make our community safer, working with each other and with city officials.

ROBG's leadership has approved a pilot project called Neighborhood Speedwatch. This will give Beverly Glen residents an

opportunity to be trained by the LAPD on the use of a radar speed gun. We will work in teams to identify vehicles that travel through Beverly Glen at excessive rates of speed, and LAPD will send warning letters to the drivers of these cars. If a vehicle is noted three times driving at an excessive speed, LAPD will make a visit to the driver's home. We need you to volunteer to be trained for this program! If you are interested, please contact our Traffic Committee chair, Evelyn Alexander, to sign up. E-mail at traffic@beverlyglen.org, or call her at 310-470-3024.

We are also working to add new functions to our website, and to allow residents to give pertinent information about accidents that occur on our main thoroughfare. The more information we have, the more we are able to work with the LAPD and city officials to improve the safety of Beverly Glen, both for residents and for those who travel through it every day.

Your Traffic Committee is also working to identify other traffic calming improvement options. All Beverly Glen residents are welcome to join in this effort – please contact Evelyn to get involved!

Glen Auto Club members will have seen in their recent *Westways* Magazine a featured article on Richard Lillard, one of its premier columnists in the 1970s, and "an early voice of environmentalism in Southern California." What the article failed to mention is that he lived in Beverly Glen on a steep hillside in Quito Lane and was one of the founders of the Residents of Beverly Glen Inc. in 1953 following the great floods of that year. He also helped found the Hillside Federation which joined together all the canyon groups so that they could speak more forcibly on behalf of legislation to regulate hillside development. His death in 1990 left others to carry on the important work of protecting our natural environment and the communities that share in it.

We thank you for your legacy, Dick Lillard.

NEWS FROM LA DOUZE

Excerpts from her newsletter:

I decided to start this year's newsletter with the weeks preceding our arrival in La Douze because much has happened since we left L.A. We just spent four days in New York City with Dara, Miriam and Thorsten. One of those days was spent at the Museum of Natural History. That was great fun and filled with nostalgia as Miriam is the third generation to be taken to the museum. The two dinosaur skeletons that I first saw when my parents took me there are still there at the entrance. Miriam was as awed by them as Dara had been and as I had been. She had a great time. The first day in New York we took her to FAO Schwartz. Miriam fell in love with an enormous German Shepherd dog that I bought for her. Fortunately for my wallet, the dog was doubly discounted and only cost \$20.00, marked down from \$80.00. Who would have thought you could buy one of FAO Schwartz's huge stuffed animals for only \$20.00? (Miriam apparently charmed a flight attendant into allowing her to hold the dog on her lap for the trip home.) On our last day, Thorsten took Miriam to Central Park to play in the giant playground while Dara and I went off to MOMA. I love that museum. I saw for the umpteenth time the Chagall I had seen the very first time I went to the museum. I got taken there by Ben Shahn — now there's a claim to fame. Looking back on that trip makes me believe in some kind of racial memory since the Chagall is the only painting I remember from that trip. We didn't get to the metropolitan or the Guggenheim — maybe next trip. I love New York. I think I've walked more in the past few days than I do in a month in Los Angeles — and that includes taking Sophie for her walk.

And now, News from La Douze:

First of all let's all gasp at the realization that this is the 20th year we've been here. We arrived to beautiful warm weather in Paris. Of course within two days it had turned to rain and cold. When we arrived down here in La Douze the weather was once again warm, sunny and dry. That meant that people were complaining that it was too warm and there hadn't been enough rain. On Friday (it's Sunday night as I write) it began to rain. It continued to rain on Saturday and rained on and off today and it's really cold

again. We toyed with the idea of making a fire in the fireplace this evening. I was too lazy to do it and Phil doesn't know how.

I'm such a Southern Californian. All I talk about is the weather. I'm in France and I should be talking about food. So, we tried a new cheese this week. It's a Pyrenean mixed sheep and cow milk cheese that's really creamy and has a nice subtle nutty flavor. I don't know if it's available in the US. I'll have to see if the cheese store in Beverly Hills has it or can order it. The local tomatoes are starting to be available as well as cherries, strawberries, early variety raspberries and early variety haricot vert. A friend stopped by so I fed him. My reward for feeding him roast chicken was a bag of ceps. I'll trade roast chicken for ceps any day. Phil and I had a great omelet for lunch the next day. Ah yes, one should talk about food when one is living in the French countryside.

THEN AND AGAIN TOWARDS A GREENER GLEN

It is 1909 and the first modern development is about to start in the Glen. It is a late April afternoon and a wide band of diffuse sunlight lies above a darker and cooler canyon bottom. The rhythmic creaking of unseen tree frogs almost echo against the quiet. Occasionally an owl's deep 'ooo' is repeated three times. White sycamore trunks turned gray by the evening shadows wind their way along a pebbly stream course. Slowly moving water passes from pool to pool and then disappears beneath a patch of sand. Where the water flows over the flattened cobbles of mountain slate a soft sound is made. Underwater, a small black beetle swims amongst dark green moss and leaf litter. This is a time when a multitude of living organisms interacts with rock, air and water to form a unique living place. This place extends in all directions connecting with neighboring ridges, then canyons; with branching streams that flowed into the ocean.

It is fall of 2009. Sycamore trunks were now seen between houses. Live oak trees competed with non-native pittosporum, eugenia hedges and an occasional pine for light and soil. There was no nature crafted stream of water, nor the animals that depend upon it for drinking, breeding, cleaning and playing. Instead, there was a two-lane road

carrying on it a stream of cars, trucks and Harley Davidsons. An average of four synthetic rubber tires per vehicle made a loud 'swishing' sound as they rolled and squealed against the grain of asphalt. Under the roadbed lay a linear network of concrete and steel pipes the largest of which carried the sporadic run-off of driveways as well as the torrents of water that would come with winter rains. Marks of the distant past were still visible on the canyon walls where large areas of chaparral lay more or less intact. A city ordinance enacted to protect a handful of native trees seemed to insure that more Coastal Live Oaks would be around to be experienced by tomorrow's children. Several local residents had backyard ponds where dripping water could be heard and where raccoons, dragonflies and migrating herons were sometimes seen.

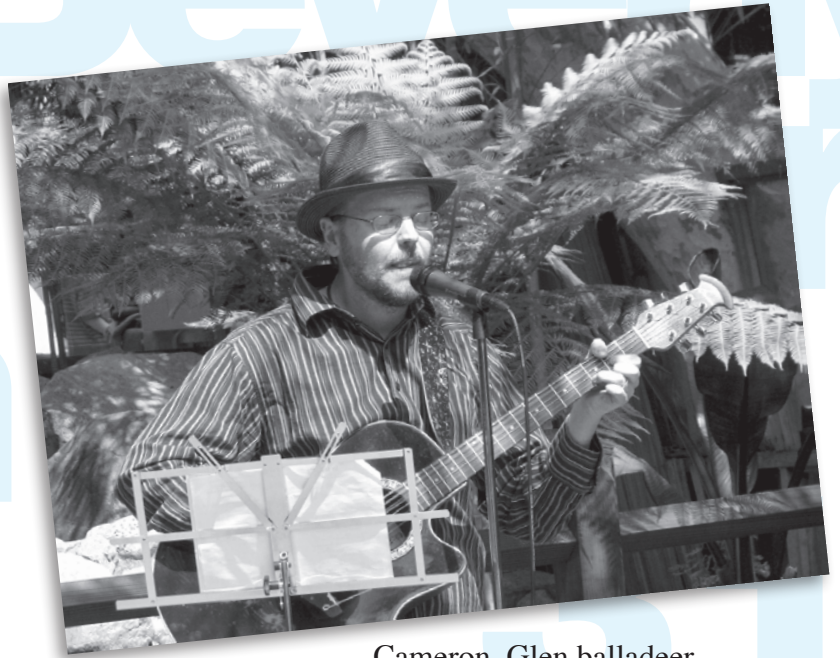
It is 2032 on a Sunday morning in November and a Beverly Glen resident of 28 years reflected on the changes that had occurred in and around his modest home within the 900 block of N. Beverly Glen Boulevard. The street was quieter as electric cars had largely replaced the noisier engine-driven autos of the past. In 2012 heavy truck traffic was banned from several canyon roads and several years later commuter van pools became the daily mode of choice as Beverly Glen Blvd. was designated as a 'local access route' whereby non-area residents had to buy special electronic permits if they desired private vehicle access to the street. The resident sat in his backyard gazing at a small stream that had been created by a pact of four adjoining neighbors. During the rainy season the run-off of a side ravine and the combined rooftops of the four homes was diverted into a small basin that fed the small stream segment. In their yards, a mix of native and exotic plants, were watered by 'gray water' cisterns associated with each house. Later that night a couple of tree frogs chirped. The stream terminated in a humble lot-sized public open space with two benches located under a large oak tree. Low walls made of local stone sheltered the space and separated it from the yards of adjacent properties. Under one corner of the mini park, invisible to the eye and one of several in Beverly Glen, an underground tank collected rain water. The water in these tanks was made available to Glen residents at a reduced cost for use in gardens and for landscaping.

It is now 2075 and in January.....!

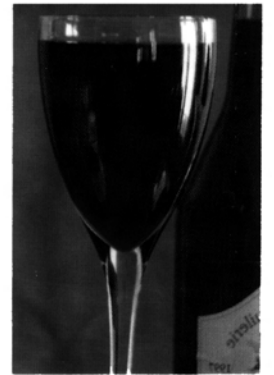
