Treasurer's Report

Linda Paddor, Outgoing Treasurer

Hello! Thank you to everyone who attended the Fair. It was a wonderful event and it was fun to see the community in action. Thanks to everyone who joined, renewed memberships, purchased raffle tickets and food tickets, made donations and contributed to the event. Because of your generous donations we made \$4,080.24! I hope you had fun and enjoyed the day as much as I did.

TRAFFIC

Your traffic committee is working hard to calm traffic on Beverly Glen and make our community safer. We have drafted and hand-delivered a letter to the Beverly Glen Market, and to the restaurants up at the Glen Centre, asking them to ask their suppliers to be considerate while driving delivery trucks through our community. We have asked them to ask for the smallest delivery truck available, to maintain the speed limit (of 30 mph) in the Glen, and also to consider varying their delivery routes, using Beverly Glen

north of Mulholland as well as our section of Beverly Glen. If you are a frequent diner at one of the Glen Centre restaurants, please let them know that you appreciate their trying to be considerate with delivery vehicles.

We are going to be placing some signs at several locations along Beverly Glen. They will have red backgrounds and white lettering, and they will remind drivers that people live in this community that they use just as a traffic shortcut. Additionally, we are working with LAPD's community Speedwatch supervisor to train members of our community to use the LAPD's laser speed gun. Once trained, we will be able to monitor traffic in small groups. Speeding drivers will be sent a letter by LAPD informing them that they have been seen speeding in our area. No tickets will be issued, but other areas with a community speedwatch have reduced the number of speeding cars in their communities through their efforts. If you would like to volunteer for this activity, please contact Evelyn Alexander at 310-470-3024, or traffic@beverlyglen.org.

As a reminder – you can help us remind the LAPD that we have a speeding problem up here – the more they hear from us, the more likely they will come enforce the speed limit. Call LAPD at 213-473-0222 and let them know if you have experienced someone driving too fast or dangerously, like zipping into oncoming traffic to go around a driver going the speed limit. LAPD needs to hear from us. You don't need to give a license plate – just let them know that we need additional speed enforcement in the Glen.

Your Traffic Committee is also working to identify other traffic calming improvement options. All Beverly Glen residents

are welcome to join in this effort – please set a good example for visitors through our community and drive the speed limit!

Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir

Many years ago, federal law required all open drinking water reservoirs to be covered for health and safety purposes. Over many years, LADWP has complied, one step was taking Lower Stone Canyon out of the drinking water system. However, Upper Stone Canyon will remain a drinking water reservoir and later this year an EIR will be made public discussing the various options. The Coalition to Preserve Open Reservoirs (CPOR) has formed an Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir Subcommittee and Residents of Beverly Glen, Inc. needs someone to represent our interests and concerns in these meetings.

THE GLEN BOWS ITS HEAD FOR DOUG WALSTROM

Doug Walstrom, a true Glen activist, died on May 17th at the age of 96. Best known for making the community center happen through his numerous trips to downtown L.A. to secure reluctant approvals from City Hall, he gave his time and energy for years to various committees and community activities. If you want to know what he left behind, just look around you. When someone like Doug passes on, he takes his place beside Glen originals like John Churchman, Les & Dorothy River and others who loved the Glen, and were responsible for the beauty and quality of life we enjoy today. He will be missed and remembered.

(The following is excerpted from a memorial handout by Diana Walstrom)

When he died, his wife of 68 years, Octavia, and his daughter, Diana, were at his side. His death ended an enviable retirement span of 31 years, with excellent health for most of them, until his heart finally wore out. He attributed his longevity to Octavia's wonderful caretaking and healthy cooking, including homemade whole wheat bread and lunchtime salads. The two made many road trips in their camper van to Alaska, Canada, and the continental USA, always finding a lake or stream in which to cast a fishing line. Never liking verbal controversy, he would simply enjoy being in the company of friends. Over the years, many neighbors enjoyed seeing Douglas and Octavia out on their twice-daily walks and at local community events. In 1937 he earned a degree in electrical engineering from the University of Minnesota. Then he went on to work on aviation projects at NACA at Langley Field, VA, where he met his future wife, Octavia Willey Seawell, a graduate of

the College of William and Mary. He fixed her radio, and then married her on March 7, 1942, in a small, wartime ceremony. With two little children, Nancy and Peter, they moved west to California, and left the snow for others to shovel. They settled in El Segundo, CA, building and living in a house they designed. Daughter Diana, a current Glen resident, was born there, joining her siblings growing up in the Los Angeles area.

Doug worked in the aerospace industry for Turbodyne, Northrop, North American Aviation, Coleman Engineering, TRW, STL, and Aerospace Corporation until his retirement in 1978. A loyal husband, father and grandfather, he is survived by his wife Octavia, his children, Nancy (m. Joseph Jabbra), Peter (m. Sharon Cook), and Diana, as well as his six grandchildren, Michael, Mary (m. James Britt), Sarah (m. Jerome Blanchard), Audrey, Eric, and Philip.

50 YEARS OF GLEN FAIR RECOGNIZED BY THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES

City Councilmember Koretz and his Deputy Jeff Ebenstein had attended the 50th Glen Fair and were really taken by the event. They thought such a community-friendly event is well worth commemorating, and invited Residents of Beverly Glen to City Hall two weeks later for a well-deserved salute in front of the entire City Council. Councilmember Koretz gave a glowing representation of the Fair. He said the Glen Fair was a charming event and a great example of the playful, graceful pleasures to be found in Los Angeles communities. ROBG members thanked him for his efforts on behalf of the community and gave a brief history of the Fair and the Glen. We were honored with a beautiful commemorative Certificate, which is now framed and on display at LDRCC.
