At-Large Board Member Positions

As some may know, BABCNC is primarily made up of stakeholder groups (like RoBG) that send designated representatives, but it's also made up of two "At-Large" positions. Due to budget cuts and inability to get elections administered by the City, BABCNC decided to hold a Town Hall Selection meeting whereby candidates are "elected" by the residents who attend this town hall meeting.

BABCNC originally approved the December, 2012 meeting but due to low turnout and as recommended by the City, BABCNC will hold its Selection at another date and time to be announced. If you're interested in being part of the democratic process and having real input (official advisory to the City), please consider becoming a candidate. Standing Rules

BABCNC is working hard to approve and implement additional standing rules that will make the organization stronger and a better platform from which to operate.

Transit

RoBG proposed a motion to ask Metro to give the San Fernando Valley transit corridor (from the Valley to West LA) a higher level of importance in their long-range plan. If you're concerned about traffic, the only way to alleviate it is to give commuters an alternative, and transit is that alternative. The motion was tabled. RoBG may seek to put it on the agenda again; we'll need your help.

Digital Billboards

California's 2nd District Court of Appeal ruled that two sign companies should not have been allowed to convert billboards to digital. Despite this, the City's PLUM committee, scheduled to discuss the sign ordinance on December 11th, postponed the discussion to January 22nd - a move most feel is to give sign lobbyists time to make the ordinance more favorable to them and to investigate ways to validate those illegal digital billboards. Rim of the Valley

Congressman Adam Schiff has initiated a resource study with the National Parks Service that considers expansion of the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area that would further protect the natural, cultural and historic resources in the area. Beverly Glen Playgroup is a parent-run cooperative preschool located in the heart of Beverly Glen. We occupy the Les and Dorothy River Community Center on Scenario Lane.

Tucked away in a quiet corner of the Glen, Beverly Glen Playgroup endorses a play-based developmental approach to learning, emphasizing the uniqueness of all children and respecting their individual rates of development. We believe that children learn by doing. Our focus is on the process of education versus the end product. In operation since 1946, "Playgroup" is a close-knit community of current students, parents, siblings, and alumni – a warm and supportive extension of home and family.

We offer a morning and afternoon program. Our morning program is for older children (must be 3 years old by September 1st of the school year), and our afternoon program is for younger children (must be 2 years old by September 1st of the school year).

As a neighborhood school, we try to give priority to Glen families, but they are not guaranteed acceptance. All families must complete their applications on time, attend a tour and be able to fulfill all co-op require-ments. Other admissions factors include the need to accommodate gender balance, siblings and alumni.

The deadline to turn in applications for the 2013-14 school year has passed; however, we do maintain an active waitlist. If you are interested in Playgroup, we still encourage you to take a tour and submit an application.

Upcoming tour dates are Thursday, February 21, 2013 Thursday, March 21, 2013 Thursday, May 23, 2013

All tours are on Thursdays and begin at 9:45 AM. (Children are not allowed on the tours.)




suggest you try a place like Switzerland, only a lot closer. That's our personal advice after driving back from our cabin at June Lake in the Eastern Sierra, just a half hour beyond Mammoth and minutes from Mono Lake. The Swiss style mountain backdrop for June Lake is supplied by the summits of the eastern edge of Yosemite Park and right now they form a vista of huge snowy peaks for as far as the eye can see. If you want a weekend of such spectacular sights, with diversions for the whole family including sledding (which our granddaughters love best), snowboarding, cross country skiing, snowmobiling, snow man building, or just plain romping in the snow, then this is the place for you. There are lots of inns and motels and restau-

rants to match, with music on Saturday nights. Our personal favorites are the Tiger Bar for breakfast, the Sierra Inn for supper, and the Double Eagle for a splurge. Many places are within walking distance of one another since the town of June Lake is a really small village. This winter June Mountain is closed for skiing but will reopen next winter. Meantime Mammoth skiing is only a half hour away, with shuttles available. GREG HEIMER: ANOTHER FRIEND LOST

reg and Dobie Heimer had been married for almost 40 years when Dobie passed away 1½ years ago. On January 24, 2013, Greg joined her. Both together and individually, they were integral, core members of the Glen community, and we shall miss them both greatly.

Greg was born on July 17, 1929, in Maywood, N.J. He graduated from the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York and then received an M.A. in Speech, Radio and Television from the U. of Alabama Communications, Film & TV School. After serving in the army during the Korean War, Greg worked as station manager for a radio station in Jacksonville, FL and as general manager of one in

Pittsburgh, PA. But he dreamed of the movies, so in 1965, he brought his then-wife, Jean Heimer, and four sons to West L.A. and attended UCLA Film School for a year. Soon Greg found work with KCET as Director of Special Projects and subsequently for Encyclopedia Britannica as Executive Producer of the West Coast Film Unit. After that, he free-lanced in many

areas, including industrial films, educational films, documentaries and narration.

Greg loved skiing, hiking and camping and was a strong Glen supporter, serving on both the LRCC and Residents boards, on many committees, and running the Annual Fair one year. A devotee of art of storytelling, he enjoyed performing his original stories for audiences and, later in life, performing improvisational pieces with an ensemble group. He put on a series of popular programs at the Center, "Sunday Afternoons in the Glen" which were plays, readings, and music, all with Glen residents. Greg also worked hard to develop a shuttle bus route from Sherman Oaks to Century City, working with the Dept. of Transportation, the Metro bus companies and Glenridge developer J.H. Snyder, who originally promised such a shuttle. But because of a variety of obstacles, it just didn't happen.

For the last few years, Greg struggled with both Alzheimer's and Parkinson's diseases. He is survived by three of his sons (from his first marriage), Jeffrey, Tony and Christopher and by his grand-children, Jennifer Heimer Bridges, Autumn Heimer Davis, Guillermo Heimer, Danielle Heimer, Ingrid Heimer, Mikaela Heimer and Melissa Heimer.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, February 23rd at 1:00pm at Gates Kingsley Gates Funeral Home, 1925 Arizona Avenue in Santa Monica. IN THE KITCHEN WITH DIANE

Easy Chicken Soup

My husband and I both came down with really severe colds these past months, and this soup was the most effective cure. It freezes well and is really yummy.

Ingredients:

- 8 chicken breasts (with skin and bones)
- 2 leeks (white part chopped)
- 1 bulb of fresh garlic (which is about 12 cloves) minced
- 1 large celery root peeled and chopped (this comes to about 1½ cups)
- 3 large parsnips peeled and chopped
- 6 large carrots sliced into chunks (I don't peel them but do use organic if possible)

Herb-infused olive oil (olive oil and herbs, see recipe)

Makes approx. 12 servings

In a large stainless steel pot, sauté the chicken in a few tablespoons of olive oil until golden brown. Add salt and pepper while sautéing. Meanwhile put all of the veggies, including leeks and garlic, into a flat, oven-proof dish (I use a stainless steel casserole dish) in a single layer. Sprinkle the veggies with a small amount of olive oil, salt and pepper, and roast in a 400 degree oven for about 45 min. or until golden brown. Add the roasted veggies to the chicken, and cover with about 5-6 quarts of water. Bring to a simmer, and then turn the heat to low for about 1 hr.

Meanwhile, make an infused herbal oil by taking fresh herbs (I use marjoram, thyme and rosemary), adding them to a few tablespoons of oil, and bringing to a slight simmer. Turn off the heat after a few seconds and let stand for an hour in the pan. Skim off any film that accumulates on the soup. Let cool a bit, and then add the infused herbal oil (not the herbs themselves).

Salt and pepper to taste (I like to use sea salt and the mixed pepper-corns with pink, white and black). Remove the chicken breasts, cool and remove skin and bones. Shred and add back into the soup. Serve with your favorite bread and enjoy!
