TRAFFIC—WHAT IT WILL TAKE TO SLOW IT DOWN?

On June 26, 2014, the Residents of Beverly Glen sponsored a forum between local residents and the Los Angeles Police Department to discuss issues relating to traffic enforcement in the Glen. LAPD West Traffic Division Captain Rolando Solano and Officer Mike Toth fielded questions from residents regarding various common traffic-related issues including the frequency of traffic enforcement patrols in the Glen.

Captain Solano advised those in attendance that he is well aware of the traffic-related issues in the Glen. Unlike several other areas throughout the city, Beverly Glen is a unique residential community which functions as a detour and alternative route for commuters who would otherwise be forced to use the

405 Interstate to travel between the San Fernando Valley and the Westside. The volume of traffic pulsing through the Glen is extraordinary. Speed awareness trailers randomly placed in the Glen over the past several months have recorded anywhere between roughly 7,000 and 10,000 vehicles passing through the Glen within a 24 hour period. These numbers have caught the LAPD's attention and despite the expansive geographic area over which the West Traffic Division operates (including Hollywood, Wilshire, West Los Angeles, Pacific, and Olympic) and the limited number of units to patrol these areas, Captain Solano pledged to increase the number of randomized patrols in the Glen.

While the LAPD cannot restrict the number of vehicles passing through the Glen, they can, and should be expected to, enforce safe speed regulations. Yet Captain Solano reported that the LAPD's hands are tied when it comes to speed enforcement because the state-mandated speed zone survey for the Glen is expired, which prevents the LAPD from using radar or laser technology in the Glen to catch speeding motorists. California law requires that a speed zone survey be conducted before radar or laser is used by police departments for the purpose of enforcing the speed limit. Without the use or radar or laser technology to determine the speed at which motorists are traveling, LAPD officers must either pace the speeding vehicle (which is extremely unsafe in the winding Glen) or estimate the vehicle's speed (for which all traffic officers are professionally trained) - both of which naturally pit the officer's word against the word of the cited motorist in the courtroom and are therefore inferior to electronically recorded speed measurements through the use of radar or laser technology.

Captain Solano reported that, based on the data recorded by the speed awareness trailers, he has opened a complaint with the DOT to update the expired speed survey. Based on my own conversations with DOT representatives, there is a severe backlog on the completion of speed surveys throughout the entire city which will take years to complete. Captain Solano corroborated the information that had been previously given to me and confirmed that approximately 70% of speed surveys in the City are expired.

The process for re-certifying the streets consists of the LADOT measuring the speed of 100 cars during a non-congested time of day, calculating the 85 percentile mark and the appropriate speed limit, asking the Councilmember if they want radar/laser enforcement, asking the LAPD if they want radar/laser enforcement, having the City Attorney draft a new ordinance which is then submitted to the Transportation Commission's consent agenda before heading off to the Transportation committee and the City council for final approval.

So, if anything is going to be done to give the LAPD the power they need to enforce safe speeds in the Glen, we must help our own cause by contacting the Department of Transportation and councilman Paul Koretz's office to demand that the speed survey for the Glen be updated. HILLSIDE FEDERATION NEWS

Councilmember Koretz submitted several motions to City Council that are of interest to us:

*No Smoking in Hillsides Motion - it is imperative that hillside areas have an adequate

number of and properly located "No Smoking" signs and that fines for violations are sufficient to act as a deterrent. The City Attorney is reviewing the feasibility of a \$1,000 fine; if feasible the amount would be posted on "No Smoking" signs.

* Wildlife Corridor Motion - wildlife corridors are vital to aid movement so that animals can move freely without getting killed and to help maintain genetic diversity. P-22 is an example of a mountain lion that crossed the freeway successfully and survived ingesting rodenticide. A mountain lion was recently killed crossing the 101. We need wildlife corridors and this motion will ensure that the City of LA takes wildlife corridors into account during the planning process. If passed, the motion would protect wildlife movement from the I-405 to Griffith Park. The City would require that all hillside properties within the boundaries of the Baseline Hillside Ordinance are reviewed prior to any approval to ensure valuable wildlife connectivity be preserved as part of the planning process. Each project would have to demonstrate that it would not negatively impact wildlife connectivity and if impacted, mitigation would be required. This would lead to permanent habitat protection.

THE "3 R'S"

Well, it's that time of year again. Lined paper, pencil boxes and protractors are on shelves at the front of the drugstore. As did we all. I first encountered the tools for those 3 R's in 1st Grade. But I had also already discovered the other kind of 3 R's: "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle," much to my mom's bewilderment, when I came into our apartment dragging a waffle iron and 3-way swing-arm lamp along with me. I'd picked them up on the landing outside Apartment #2A while walking up the four flights to mine. Since they wouldn't fit into the incinerator trapdoor, to be dropped down the chute to the basement and burned, they'd been left for the "Super" to handle. When I spotted them, they looked fine, and thought we could use them. I loved the waffles my grandma made. Although my mother had a fit initially, they were put to good use for many years at our "summer house at the lake."

I've been "collecting" and "reusing" ever since. The "burgeoning bottles" periodically need to be purged (the jars from instant coffee, peanut butter, etc., are valuable in the REUSE department but enough is enough - so then they're RECYCLED, while I REDUCE on a personal level.)

That's what this new addition to the Glenite is intended to be all about - an exchange of information and ideas. I'll try to find the answers to questions you send me about environmental and sustainability concerns; grants that may be available for your pet project; actions in which we can participate individually or as a community.

First to think about - Do you recycle? Do you think about what should go into the blue instead of the black bins so it doesn't add to already overfilled land-fills (dumps)? To wash or not to wash first? What to do with used clothing? Send me your questions, and I'll reply personally and/or answer in the next Glenite.

I'm a member of a few different "Green" groups, e.g., as Senior Advisor on the City of LA, Office of Community Beautification's KLAB (Keep LA Beautiful) Committee, which has direct links to Sanitation and Public Works Department information, with grants available to local "green projects".

MEDED, (Making Every Day "Earth Day")

IN THE KITCHEN WITH DIANE

TIRAMISU (no eggs and no baking)

We recently had a birthday lunch served by our good friend, Tatiana, and she served this delicious tiramisu. She had used 3 egg yolks; I replaced that with whipped cream for this recipe.

Prep time: 30 minutes to put together and 6 hours in the refrigerator. Use a 13 x 9 baking dish.

Ingredients

1 1/2 cups brewed espresso or strong French roast coffee (room temp)

I shot of cognac

3 8 oz containers of mascarpone cheese

4 tbs superfine sugar

1 1/2 cups heavy cream

24- 30 Italian ladyfingers (Forno Bonomi is the best, which can be found at Italian or Persian markets)

Unsweetened cocoa powder or coarsely grated dark chocolate for decoration

Directions:

Mix the coffee and liqueur together in a bowl and set aside. Mix the mascarpone and sugar in a bowl until the sugar dissolves. Whip the cream in another bowl until it holds its shape, and fold it into the mascarpone mixture. Divide this into two bowls. Now the layering: Start with the ladyfingers. Dip and turn one ladyfinger at a time in the coffee mixture until just moistened, not soggy, and place it in the dish (lying flat) Repeat this until the whole bottom is covered with the ladyfingers (side by side, flat). After you have laid down your lady fingers cover them with half of the mascarpone mixture. Add another layer of ladyfingers (dipped in coffee). Layer the remaining mascarpone on the top ofyour second row of lady fingers, and smooth the surface. Cover the bowl withplastic wrap, and refrigerate for at least 6 hours. Just before serving sprinkle the top with either sifted cocoa powder or grated dark chocolate to taste.


